# Assembly & Usage Instructions

From box to water in under 5 minutes.

Your DeSkuzzer arrives folded, with the net, floats, and rope harness already installed. Here is everything you need to know, from unboxing to your first pass, plus a few workshop tips that make it easier. Get your DeSkuzzer on the water in minutes.



## WHAT YOU'RE WORKING WITH

### A 54-inch floating seine net, fully assembled, no tools.

The DeSkuzzer collects surface debris as you pull it across your pond or lake. Five parts do the work; it arrives fully assembled and ready to use, and your pull rope is included in the package.



- Top bar
- Weighted bottom bar
- Vertical floats, one at each end
- Debris-catching net
- Orange rope harness

# Assembly Unfold, insert, snap.



## 1 Lay it flat and unfold it

Getting your DeSkuzzer on the water in under 5 minutes is easy. Set the DeSkuzzer on a flat surface, find the top bar, and unfold it at the intersecting point.



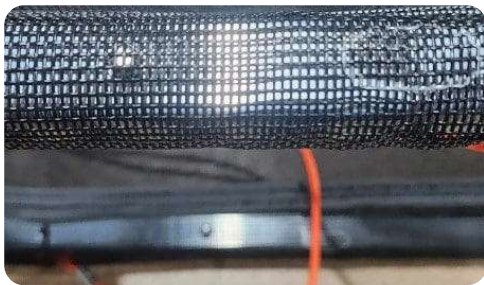
## 2 Find the intersecting points

Find where the square aluminum tubes meet. On the right-hand assembly, both top and bottom, the snap buttons are on the top face of the tube, under the net.



## 3 Insert the tube

Insert the smaller right-hand tube into the larger tube. Alternate between the top bar and the bottom bar, pushing each until the snap buttons reach the larger tube.



## 4 Press in the snap buttons

Press the buttons, the top one first, then the bottom, and keep inserting until each one seats into its hole. A slight back-and-forth wiggle helps the buttons find their place.



## 5 One snap, and you're done

When both buttons snap into their holes, assembly is complete. Spread the net over the frame and you're ready.

*Assembly complete: both snap buttons are seated in the large bar.*

**Before you launch:** pull out the orange harness and make sure it's clear of the net.

# Getting it on the water The toss method.

This is how most owners deploy the DeSkuzzer, from shore or from a boat. It takes a few tries to get the knack, and after that it becomes second nature.



## 1 Loop the rope around your wrist

First things first, slip the loop at the end of the rope around your wrist so the pull rope doesn't follow the DeSkuzzer into the water.



## 2 Take your grip

Let the rope hang free. Place your throwing hand behind one float and guide the top bar with your other hand.



## 3 Swing and release

With a pendulum motion, toss the DeSkuzzer toward the stretch of water you want to clean, then let go.



## 4 Drag it back slowly

Pull the “skuzz” toward you at an easy pace. Then set the DeSkuzzer face down to empty the net.

**Protect the components:** never toss the DeSkuzzer onto dry land or against rocks in the water.

## OTHER WAYS TO DEPLOY IT

### Tossing isn't the only option.

#### From shore (the classic method)

Toss from land and retrieve with the pull rope: toss – pull – empty.

#### In front of a rowboat

Hold it ahead of the boat with a pole or gaff, sold separately.

#### Wading

Pull it behind you as you walk or stand in shallow water.

#### Shore to shore

Pass it back and forth between two people on opposite banks.

**Harness tip:** if the lower part of the orange harness gets in the way of collecting debris, just detach it.

## TIPS FROM THE WORKSHOP

### Work smart, not soaked.

- Let the wind gather the “skuzz” before you make your pass.
- Pull the DeSkuzzer slowly through the water; rushing makes you lose debris.
- Don't overload it: the limit is 50 pounds per pass, and lighter passes are easier anyway.
- Work one section at a time and be persistent; think of it like mowing the lawn.
- Empty the “skuzz” onto the ground in the sun: it's more than 90% water, so it dries fast and becomes light enough to handle easily.

### After the water: storage

The frame is aluminum. Dry it completely after use, then store it out of the sun. That's all the maintenance it needs.

This model replaces the 2023 version with a few improvements. The older demo videos still apply, since both models are used the same way.
